

over every student who participates in an internship. It was assured that departments other than the Political Science Department are involved and that Dean Stephenson's office is aware of the situation.

Motion was made that the Chairman write to the Registrar requesting that he put a control on student's registration in Experiential Education courses until he is informed that a learning contract has been approved and signed by all appropriate parties. The letter to Dean Ockerman is to be transmitted through Dean Stephenson. Motion was seconded and passed.

4) Annual Report: Senate Research Committee

Chairman Bryant called on Professor Eichhorn, Chairman of the Research Committee. His comments follow.

We are submitting this as an annual report. This report concludes with a number of recommendations. As a minimum we want the University Senate to accept the report; I would prefer, however, that the Senate endorse the report for submission to the Administration.

Following discussion it was moved that the Senate Council endorse the recommendations and recommend the Senate's endorsement and urge the administration to implement the recommendations as appropriate. Motion was seconded.

It was noted that one Council member who was detained in another meeting had not had an opportunity to comment on the report and action on the motion was tabled informally to a later time in the meeting.

5) Proposed change in Biochemistry M.S. and Ph. D.

Motion to accept was made and seconded.

Discussion followed during which concern was expressed that this kind of request had been made before without sufficient background and rationale. In response to these concerns, Professor Schwert offered the following comments:

The proposed changes in the graduate programs in Biochemistry (reducing the foreign language requirement from two to one) were initiated because (1) most good programs in the country require only one language and, (2) currently, almost all scholarly work in Biochemistry is published in English so the need for two languages has been lessened.
