This curricular map shows that students can complete the IS Major in two years. It is important to note that this is based on the assumption that all the UK Core requirements, and all College of Arts and Sciences requirements, have been completed successfully before Year 3, with the exception of the 39 hours at or above the 300-level requirement. This plan also assumes that a student has completed through the fourth semester level of a foreign language.

International Studies majors are strongly encouraged to undertake an Education Abroad experience as part of their degree. In the Two Year curricular map above, it is possible for a student to study abroad during the summer, semester, or for a full academic year. Students should consult with their academic advisor about the best time to study abroad.
