Create secure LSAC.org account.

Go to www.lsac.org. Upload a recent photograph, a requirement for your LSAT admission ticket.

Register for the LSAT.

Research law schools.

Pay for Credential Assembly Service (CAS).

CAS is required by all ABAaccredited law schools and compiles transcripts and letters of recommendations in your law school report.

Request transcripts.

Request transcripts from all postsecondary institutions attended and have them sent to LSAC. Allow at least two weeks for processing.

Review your Academic Summary Report.

View your report in your LSAC.org account.

Request letters of recommendation.

Download forms from your LSAC. org account to ensure timely processing of your letters.

Write/revise personal statemen

your personal statement is the besit can be. Pay close attention to quidelines from each law school.



Create your resume and any other addenda or optional essays for your application.

Take your resume to the Stuckert Career Center for review. Consider whether you need to submit addenda to explain any weaknesses or character/fitness issues to the admissions committee.

Apply online to law school.

Apply to the law schools of your choice through your LSAC.org account. Make sure you proofread! Keep in mind that many schools use rolling admissions, so the earlier you apply, the better.

Pay for LSAC reports and submit applications.
