"Consensual Non-monogamous Relationships (CNM): A Spanish View on a Radical Reorganization of Sexual and Affective Relationships"

Given that monogamy is a social construct that supports patriarchy and amatonormativity, it impacts our daily lives and our most personal decisions. Nevertheless, consensual non-monogamous relationships (CNM) can undermine the imposition of monogamy in society by upsetting the logic of monogamy and by restructuring people's affects to create more inclusive and feminist relationships. Select Spanish literary and filmic works from the early twenty first century introduce throughe relationships that still reflect the fears and tensions of monogamous relationships. Their plots tend to cast an immoral value to CNM and monogamy ultimately prevails over unworkable CNM models. In the second decade of the twenty first century, however, new theoretical developments and innovative literary practices join forces to offer a refashioning of CNM models that celebrates diversity and inclusiveness. It is significant that this shift in values acquires visibility at this particular time and especially through the creative narratives of people whose personal lives reveal CNM relationships.
